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POLICY FOR SCHOOL UNIFORM

INTRODUCTION

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school and when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. A complete list of the items needed for the school uniform, are in our school prospectus and details are available from the school office.

Wearing a uniform is a badge of pride, creates an identity for a school and is an important part of being a school student.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- creates a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

JEWELLERY

On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears. We request children to remove these objects during PE and games.

HAIR

The school does not permit children to have haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. Long hair should be tied up at all times, especially during PE. Parents should also be aware that tattoos, temporary or otherwise, are not permitted.

FOOTWEAR

All children are expected to wear smart black shoes as part of the appropriate school uniform. In line with health and safety regulations, children are not allowed to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels in school. Trainers are permissible as part of the PE uniform but these should be brought in to school in the PE bag and worn only during PE.

PROCEDURE AND SANCTIONS

Students must wear the full school uniform to school daily; this includes the school blazer during Autumn/Spring terms. PE uniform should be brought in a school bag on their PE days.

Regular uniform checks are carried out and students wearing the correct uniform are awarded points that contribute to their overall total of points on the school reward charts.

The following procedure will be followed to enforce the correct uniform:

1. Verbal reminder to the child.
2. Written note in the child's diary.
3. Verbal reminder to parent.
4. Written letter to parent from the admin office.

Students who fail to attend in full school uniform regularly will be withheld from attending class and the parents contacted to bring in the student's uniform in full.

A failure to bring in the full PE kit will also result in children being withdrawn from PE class and given alternative work during that lesson.

EXCEPTIONS

During the month of Muharram students are eligible to wear the following:

Boys – Black Shirt, remaining uniform to remain consistent with regular uniform code

Girls – Black Scarf, remaining uniform to remain consistent with regular uniform code
