
Reporting school KS2 SATS results

The national curriculum tests are summative. This means they test the knowledge a pupil has acquired across the whole of the key stage. They are presented as scaled scores, a pupil's scaled score is based on their raw score. The raw score is the total number of marks a pupil scores in a test, based on the number of questions they answered correctly. Tests are developed each year to the same specification, but because the questions must be different, the difficulty of tests may vary slightly each year. The range of scaled scores available for each KS2 test is the same and will stay the same in future years:

80 is the lowest scaled score that can be awarded

120 is the highest scaled score

A pupil awarded a scaled score of 100 or more has met the expected standard in each test. A pupil awarded a scaled score of 99 or less has not met the expected standard in the test.
